Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

When we practice these virtues we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us. We celebrate the Virtue of the month at an assembly each month. Classes present the virtue of the month so that students are able to see how living the Virtues reflects the values and teachings of Jesus Christ. Students are awarded a certificate and Virtue necklace. Families are invited to attend. We incorporate the Virtues into our daily announcements and Colour Group activities as well. In addition, we use our Virtues to guide discussions around performing good actions according to a moral standard.
